Course Description This programme is designed to give students an introduction to the automotive industry. The course includes working on safe

workshop practices, tool and equipment use and maintenance, battery testing and servicing, soldering and light vehicle servicing procedures. Students will also gain an understanding of mechanical and electrical fundamentals and environmental and sustainable practices in the automotive industry. Employability Skills are taught and emphasised throughout the course and students are required to do at least 20 days of structured work placement which helps enable them to gain a more realistic understanding of the career pathway and in some cases, if fortunate, it may assist them to gain a start in the workforce.

Pathways This program is a good introduction to Certificate II in Automotive - Servicing Technology and can lead to a wide range of work

in the Automotive Pathway including; Automotive Mechanic (Light / Heavy Vehicles / Aviation / Bicycle / Motor Cycle I Marine), Diesel Mechanic, Auto Electrician, Panel Beater, Spray painter, Vehicle Trimmer, Automotive Parts Interpreter, Vehicle or Parts

Sales, Tyre Fitter, Engine Reconditioning, Performance Tuning and Car Detailing etc.

With further training and entry into university, this course could lead to Automotive Engineering.

Entry Requirements Students must possess a sound Maths and Literacy ability and have a genuine interest in working in the Automotive Industry.

This Certificate I can be used to meet the requirements of the VETRO application for the Certificate II. The course is developed

for entry to employment or further education.

Other Requirements Regular attendance to class and the completion of work on time, is essential. Students must also be prepared to complete work

at home when required. Students will be issued with a Regional VET uniform, at no cost, (i.e. Work shirt and Trousers), which must be worn at all times. Students are also required to wear steel toe-capped safety footwear which must be purchased before the commencement of the course and be worn at all times. Students are also required to wear eye protection (supplied) and must have any long hair tied back. Students will need to bring writing equipment, (i.e. pens and pencils etc.), to every session to

complete the theory booklets.

The qualification requires compulsory work placement (152 hrs) and this is in addition to the training sessions. Work placement may be done during the school holidays and students are encouraged to complete 2 weeks per semester to minimise the impact

on their SAGE work. Work placement completed in Certificate I can be counted towards the Certificate II qualification.
